OUR CHILDREN LEARNING FIRST WORDS ON APPS

IRISH babies are learning their first words from apps and this may stunt development, the Irish Daily Mail can reveal.

Now parenting and psychology experts have voiced their concern that the children are at risk of growing up unable to catch a ball or even safely cross the road.

The uncontrolled use of the internet along with tablets and smartphones could create a generation out of touch with reality, and unable to relate socially... or bond with their mothers, they have warned.

Parenting expert, and mother of two, Laura Haugh told the Mail that children under the age of two are learning to speak from lullaby apps on tablets.

And cyber psychologist Mary Aiken said some parents are plugging their
