


THE WEATHER



TEXT TAX SCAM ALERT

Revenue in warning over hoax

A PENSIONER has warned the public of scam text messages promising refunds from the taxman.

They offer a website link and login code to claim cash back from the Revenue - once they submit their bank details.

John McMahon, a 71-year old grandfather of four from Poppintree in North Dublin, received the text message at 10.45am last Friday.

He said: "They've nothing to take on me but it's just that there's other poor individuals out there who weren't aware or who weren't bright enough to cop on and I just want a general warning to go out.

"I thought I might have been owed tax on the sale of a house or something, property tax or something. But I'm a

pensioner, I don't pay tax. I thought something might have been there but then when the logic came through, you don't get these things on mobile phone, you get letters.

"And there's a red letter saying you owe them tax. They never come out saying, 'We owe you tax.'"

Gardai have been called in after hundreds of the fraudulent texts were received.

They read: "Your tax refund is being prepared for payment. Please visit www.irevenue.com and enter your specially assigned ITC Key: 2619 to complete the process."

But Revenue spokeswoman Michelle Carroll told the Irish Mirror: "Gardai are aware of it. But it's nothing to do with Revenue or our systems. We have a warning on our website.

"There are currently fraudulent emails and text messages purporting to come from Revenue in circulation.
